Greetings Good Shepherd Family-

We've all been there. Everyone in the family is going different directions – mom, dad, and kids. After a while somebody says, "We need to talk, we need to exchange, we need to plan. ***We need a meeting!***"

Good Shepherd is a family too and all of us are busy. So, aside from worshipping together, we rarely discuss who we are, what we are doing, and where we are going. We need a meeting! Actually, we need a *series of conversations* and that's what I hope we can do.

I want to ask you to participate in a series of conversations to discuss, share, and learn. When we get busy as a congregation our announcements can get overloaded. Besides, the middle of the liturgy is not the time to lose our spiritual momentum. But, we are in the habit of doing ALL of our Church stuff within the context of the liturgy. If it doesn't happen between "Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit" and "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord," it doesn't happen.

There is a lot more to our common life together than our worship. We need to have regular conversation about our budget and this Fall's pledge drive. We need to take stock of who we are: what we like and appreciate and what we need to improve on. We need to learn what God has gifted us to do and what we can offer to one another. We need to learn about all the ministry opportunities we share. We need to take stock of "Final Things" like funeral plans, wills, power of attorney discussions and ways to take care of Good Shepherd when we go to be with the Father. We need to connect with ourselves – new members, long standing members, and brand new folks. When, where, how? The

newsletter, bulletin announcements, phone messages, email and Facebook posts are all great – but they can't match what happens when we talk and interact as a group without the restraints of the liturgy.

For a long time now we have carved out space between the two morning services to eat breakfast, do Sunday school and visit. This Fall we will offer some structured breakfast conversations that will help us learn about our gifts, each other, our congregation and what directions we sense God is inviting us to take. I'm mentioning this now because I want you to be looking forward to this Breakfast Conversation Schedule and make a point of coming. A good general habit for all of us would be to commit to a fuller Sunday morning that includes the worship liturgy AND the conversation time between liturgies that will unlock our energies, vision, and future. What do you say? Let's all make this coming year at Good Shepherd special by discovering who we are as a community and what God is calling us to become.

Hoping you have an enjoyable summer and looking forward to an exciting program year as we serve God together.
