Chateau Chatter

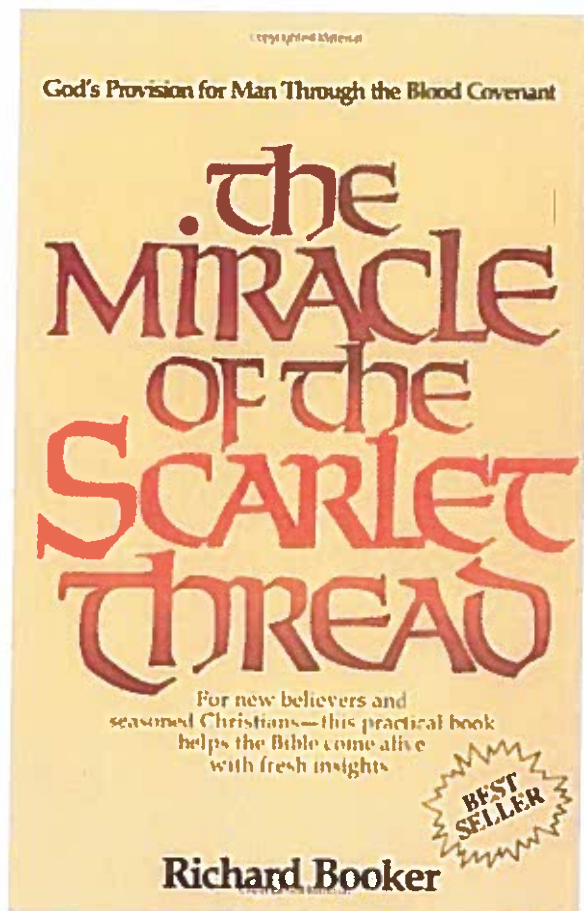

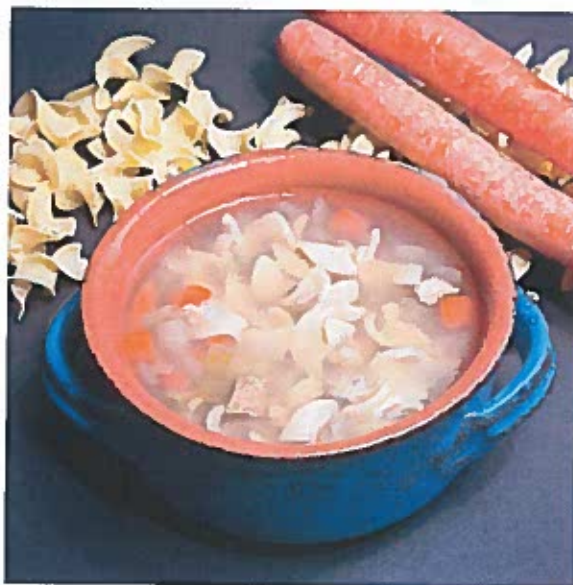

Lenten Lunch Program



**Join us for 5 Wednesdays
at 12 noon beginning
March 8th.**

This year's program will combine the regularly scheduled Wednesday noon Eucharist, with a soup lunch and teaching by Fr. Myers. We will begin with the 12:00 Eucharist combining Fr. Jack's talk on the theme of Blood Sacrifice found throughout the Old Testament tracing its development and deep meaning from Abraham and Isaac to the crucifixion of our Lord Jesus. Following Eucharist we will enjoy our soup lunch and fellowship. We should be finished before 1:00 PM.

Understanding the Old Testaments' meaning of Blood Sacrifice helps connect us to Jesus' death upon the cross in a way that goes deeper than the meaning of Atonement for Sins only, and reveals the depth of God's love. Jesus' life, death and resurrection were always God's "Plan A" and the development of the sacrificial system seen in the scriptures is God's way of making sure we do not miss the meaning of the cross.
